Word, singers sang inspiring songs, and teachers challenged our minds with their teaching. But inwardly we knew that God was doing some very special work on the hearts of young people. No

> fewer than people accepted Jesus Christ for the first time, 28 of those being baptized at our facilities immediately. Many others were baptized upon return to their home churches. 133 people

realized that they were not living the Christian life to its fullest and rededicated their lives to God. And what might be the most unexpected blessing, at least 56 people dedicated their lives to full time Christian service. Who knows how many others were surely touched in untold ways! EPCC hired four college interns, a secretary, a maintenance person, a head cook, and an assistant cook this summer. Overall, camper numbers were up. Youth camps totaled 152 more campers this year than last! Adult camps and family camps were down about 59 campers. That adds to a total increase of 93 campers for the year. Praise God for a great year!

UPCOMING PROJECTS

There are many upcoming projects on the drawing board for this off-season. One of our biggest projects is a complete renovation of the Whispering Creek cabin so that we may use it for staff housing next summer. The board of trustees also just agreed to take advantage of the income achieved by increased camper numbers this summer by purchasing a much needed brand new work truck. In addition, we are applying for permits to build a new bathhouse

generator for the new dining hall. So far we have collected around \$5,000 of the estimated \$12,000+ needed for the generator. Other projects include continuing our current forest thinning project which is nearing its deadline, upgrading our dial up internet to high-speed satellite internet, repairing camp roads, burying overhead electrical lines around camp, installing a new tank-less hot water heater for the McBride Cabin, improved lighting in key places, and much more!

NEW NURSES STATION AND MORE!

Martinez room #1 is now our summer nurse's quarters. With its central location and roomy accommodations, this recent change was a hit this summer. We put a wall up in the lobby separating it from the other two rooms and added a vanity with sink in room #1.

Other new additions to the camp include 6 new picnic tables built by the Paramount Terrace (soon to be Hillside) Christian Church middle school group from Amarillo who camp up to work over spring break.

Our new kitchen now has several additions in equipment including a commercial grade microwave, a brand new floor mixer, new front loading washer and dryer, and several other smaller items.

The dining hall also sports newly laid concrete on its west porch and upgraded porch swings. The addition of snow jacks on the roof ensure that our new down spouts and gutters don't get ripped off by this winter's snow fall.

Other projects involved upgrading wiring and plumbing in several locations as well as regular maintenance duties such as treating the exterior of the log cabins and some minor drainage and road work.
