In A Nut Shell

2009 was certainly a season to remember for many reasons. Campers benefited from the improvements that were made to the facilities over the off season. Chapel worship was enhanced by new video technology, camper comfort in the metal dorm bathrooms stepped up to compete with our other facilities, a new gazebo and sheltered campers near the ball field. We also converted part of the old hotel into an office complex until a new



office can be built. But what excites us most is not the improvements made to facilities, but the improvements made to lives! I am thrilled to report that at least 58 young people accepted Christ as their personal Lord and Savior at our youth camps this summer. In addition, 114 rededicated their lives to the Lord and 62 committed their lives to full time vocational ministry. This reinforces our belief that getting away from "normal" life to focus on God is an essential part of growing up into Christ...and there is NO BETTER PLACE than El Porvenir to do so!

Remaking A Man

God uses EPCC in a variety of ways.

This year we met William. William was the son of an abusive father and as an adult quickly fell into drug addiction and homelessness. For 17 straight years, crack cocaine dominated his existence as he wandered from underpass to homeless shelter. William was afflicted and alone.

Then we met Alvin. Alvin's wife of 13 years died in 2005 giving birth to their daughter Madison. In 2006, Alvin's parents both passed away and his brother committed suicide in Alvin's house. Then his best friend was killed in an auto accident. Finally, this past year his two little angels, his daughters ages 4 and 7, were killed when his house burned down while he was away at work. Alvin was left alone and angry with God.

On August 21, 2009 at the hot springs near the camp in Montezuma, New Mexico, William, age 48, and Alvin, age 37, were raised up out of the waters of baptism and God gave them a new start in life. These men, just 2 of

14 who spent 7 days at EPCC, are part of a recovery program facilitated by John 3:16 mission from Tulsa, Oklahoma. For the past three years, John 3:16 has brought men from the program to EPCC and challenged them to step out of their comfort zone and allow God to remake them into the men He intended them to "Some of these guys have never be. known love or the fellowship of a Christian community until entering this program," says group leader Sean Moore. The retreat from John 3:16 is just one of many outside groups who come here and are met by God in a dramatic way.

Keeping Our Edge


